Nazi Propaganda Analysis

Assignment: Select **one** example of <u>Nazi propaganda</u> that we looked at in class. Analyze the example to create a written analysis of the propaganda. Your analysis should answer the following questions:

- What does the propaganda depict?
- What message is the propaganda trying to communicate?
- How could this propaganda have contributed to genocide during the Holocaust?
- Exceeds: What does historical context reveal about the propaganda?
 - Possible questions to consider: Where do the ideas in this propaganda come from? What was happening in the world at the time of the propaganda that informs our understanding of the propaganda? What role does the propaganda play in the Nazi plans for genocide?
- Exceeds: What are the similarities and differences between this example and other Nazi propaganda?

Your analysis should be a **maximum** of **400 words**.
